NHSS12C Operative – Mobile Lane Closures (MLC) on motorways and high speed dual carriageways. 12C Operative Trainee category allows you to work on motorways and high speed dual as an advance sign carrying vehicle driver under a qualified 12C Supervisor as part of a mobile closure crew, a fully qualified 12C Operative can actively operate as part of a MLC crew under the direction of 12C Supervisor(s).

Who should attend?

All persons who will be required by their employer to work on motorways and or high-speed dual carriageways as a mobile lane closure operative (advance sign vehicle driver).

What will be covered?

- be aware of reference documentation relevant to Mobile Lane Closure techniques
- be able to conduct pre-works checks on MLC advance warning vehicles and trailers
- understand the roles and responsibilities of an MLC operative
- understand the principles and practical techniques when carrying out Mobile Lane Closures

Other areas of interest

Full 12C Operative status can be gained by completing the 12C Operative training course and minimum of 3 practical assessments are required. The assessments must be completed within a two-year period starting from the date of the 1st assessment. The registration as an NHSS12C Operative will only become effective if both the 12C Operative logbook of assessments have been completed AND the one-day 12C Operative course certificate/skill is valid.
