Knowing how to use medicines safely and effectively on your farm helps both your individual enterprise and the wider industry as well.

Who should attend?

What will be covered?

- Know when and how to use NSAID medicines (e.g., Metacam, Ketofen)
- Understand the responsibility of those administering medicines to farm animals – Welfare / Safety / Public health
- Safely and effectively administer veterinary medicines by different routes – drenching / bolusing / subcutaneous / intramuscular / intravenous injection.
- Understand the importance of an active farm health plan
- Understand how to comply with drug legislation, assurance standards and Record keeping
