- Trap types - We look at the various trap types, the pros and cons and matching the correct trap for the right circumstances.
- Complex Capture Cases - Dealing with the non-typical situation and at what point to elevate to a higher skill set.
- Post-capture Handling & Care - We study the methods of reducing stress and injury to captured dogs.
- New equipment and techniques - We study what new kit is available and how to use it to make your job easier.
- Using night vision infra red camera equipment and thermal equipment and mapping techniques to aid dog location – You will learn about the effective use of specialist equipment and search strategies.
