Introduction

An introduction to peatland restoration, including a site visit to see restoration work being carried out.

Overview in brief

This course will give land managers and others who work with upland peatland habitats an understanding of its importance for nature and climate.

It will explain how they can practically make a difference to the peatland they manage, explaining a variety of restoration techniques, surveying and planning, and sources of funding.

The finer details

- What are peatlands and what's the problem?
- Peatland restoration techniques:
 - Hag reprofiling
 - Ditch blocking
 - Gully blocking with peat dams
 - Gully blocking with timber reinforcements
 - Access and ground damage
 - Considerations to methods
- Things to consider when developing a restoration plan
- Funding restoration work and monitoring
